1 Lion's Pond

Difficulty: Easy
Distance: .8 miles

Details: A casual walk around Lion's Pond also provides fishing

opportunities and areas to rest along the path.

2 Rifle Creek Trail

Difficulty: Easy
Distance: 2 miles

Details: Paved trail following Rifle Creek. This is Rifle's backbone trail

and connects three of its main parks.

3 Raynard Ditch Trail

Difficulty: Easy Distance: 1 mile

Details: Wonderful views of the Roan Plateau and Rifle. The trail also

provides beautiful views of rock formations.

4 JQS Trail/Hubbard Mesa

Difficulty: Difficult
Distance: 8.65 miles

Details: Enjoy beautiful views of the town of Rifle as well as the

surrounding mountains.

5 Rifle Arch Trail

Difficulty: Easy to Moderate

Distance: 1.18 mile

Details: Beautiful flowers during the spring and early summer. Excellent

views of the Roan Plateau and surrounding areas.

6 Koper's Trail

Difficulty: Easy
Distance: .4 miles

Details: Access to excellent ice and rock climbing. Views are of beautiful cliff walls, caves and the Rifle Creek.

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7 Three Forks Trail

Difficulty: Moderate to Difficult

Distance: 5.86 miles

Details: There is great fishing in the beaver ponds along the route. Numerous gulches along the way create a beautiful scenic environment.

8 Cherry Creek Trail

Difficulty: Difficult
Distance: 4.89 miles

Details: The vegetation type along the trail's lower stretch is Gamble Oak. Spruce and fir dominate the landscape at higher elevations.

9 East Elk Creek Trail

Difficulty: Difficult

Distance: 5 miles

Details: The first few miles of the trail are moderately sloping.

Approximately 3.5 miles from the trail head is Spring Creek.

10 Beaver Creek Trail

Difficulty: Moderate
Distance: 3.5 miles

Details: Spectacular views of West Mamm, Mamm Peaks, Roan Plateau,

Flat Tops, Mount Sopris and Rifle.

The endless views are spectacular and you won't be able to resist stopping Take exit 90 off I-70, visit the Rifle Area Chamber of Commerce located next to the Colorado River and begin your journey with trail #1 on our list, "Lion's Pond". The serenity is overwhelming as a fisherman throws the perfect cast over the lake. In the distance a bald eagle soars over the Colorado River. Off to the right you notice a beautiful glow, referred to as "alpine glow", casting rays of scarlet pinks and purples as the sun begins to set behind the Roan Plateau.

The mild climate adds to the area's appeal, along with having access to the great outdoors literally out one's back door. The outdoor activities are as diverse as the seasons they accompany. 
